Title III: Quick Reference Guide - Fund Code 24153

Title III, Part A, is officially known as the Language Instruction for English Learner (EL) and Immigrant Students Act (Section 3102 of ESSA lists the purpose of the law). The overarching purpose is to ensure that EL students, including immigrant children and youth, attain English language proficiency and meet the same challenging state academic standards that other students are expected to meet.



The Local Education Agency (LEA) must use Title III funds to supplement state language instruction educational programs, designed to assist EL students' achievement goals. The state educational agency (SEA), LEAs, and schools are accountable for increasing the English proficiency and core academic content knowledge of EL students.

Supplement not Supplant in Title III

- Title III is a supplemental grant. Title III cannot be used to fund activities that are required to be provided by the district for the education of ELs to meet the requirement of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act, or other federal, state and local requirements.
- As a general rule, if a particular activity was paid with other funds, the same activity cannot be
 paid with Title III funds in the current year. The use of Title III funds to pay for services to ELs
 that were paid for in prior years with federal, state, or local funds raises a presumption of
 supplanting.
- All expenses in addition to being allowable, have to be necessary and reasonable. § 200.403(a)

Amendments

- Required when there is any significant change in program objectives; any increase or decrease
 in the total amount of the grant; an increase in a line of the budget

 an <u>Amendment</u> must be
 completed.
- All expenses must have a completed and signed <u>Approval</u> form.
